More than 95,000 premises added to QLD construction plan

nbn updates national construction plan

nbn today released its quarterly update to the national construction plan, adding 95,000 Queensland homes and businesses to the rollout of the **nbn**TM network.

New areas that have been added to the rollout include Buderim, Narangba, Springfield, Roma, Tully, Weipa and many others.

The construction plan provides an indicative schedule of work to begin before the end of December 2016, and now covers more than 400,000 Queensland homes and businesses.

nbn spokesperson Ryan Williams said:

"The addition of more than 95,000 homes and businesses is great news for Queensland and really demonstrates that the rollout continues to grow.

"Our job is to help bridge the digital divide by ensuring that all Australians have access to fast broadband as soon and as cost-effectively as possible.

"This is exciting news for the areas which have been added to our construction schedule because it means work to deliver fast broadband is expected to be underway by December 2016."

The rollout of the **nbn**TM network continues to gain momentum; more than 200,000 homes and businesses across Queensland are already able to connect.

nbn is planning to release a three-year rollout plan in the near future, where more communities will be added to the roll out plan, including those in HFC areas.

- **nbn's** strategic goals include connecting eight million premises to fast broadband and achieving annual revenue of \$4 billion by 2020.
- **nbn's** current rollout schedule includes all technology in the Multi-Technology-Mix with the exception of HFC and the Long Term Satellite Service. These technologies will be added in a future forecast.
- Your experience including the speeds actually achieved over the **nbn**[™] network depends on the technology over which services are delivered to your premises and other factors outside our control such as your equipment quality, software, broadband plans and how your service provider designs its network.
- The technology deployed in these communities may also change depending on a number of factors once the construction planning stage has been finalised.
- The exact number of premises as well as the regions covered in the rollout plan may vary once **nbn** has finalised its construction planning.
