disclosable conduct	 nbn or another agency; 		
(see s 29, PID Act)	 a public of alother agency, a public official in connection with their position; and/or a contracted service provider in connection with entering into or giving effect to a Commonwealth contract, if that conduct: contravenes a local law, or contravenes a foreign law that applies to nbn, the public official or the contracted service provider; perverts the course of justice; involves corruption of any kind (including "corrupt conduct" for the purposes of the NACC Act); constitutes maladministration, including conduct that is based on improper motives or is unreasonable, unjust, oppressive or negligent; is an abuse of public trust; is fabrication, falsification, plagiarism or deception relating to scientific research, or other misconduct in relation to scientific evaluation, analysis or advice; results in wastage of public money or public property; unreasonably endangers health and safety; endangers the environment; is prescribed by the PID rules; involves, or is engaged in for the purpose of, a public official abusing their position; and/or could give reasonable grounds for disciplinary action resulting in termination of the public official. Personal work-related conduct is not disclosable conduct unless the conduct: would constitute taking a reprisal against another person, or an offence of taking reprisal; or 		
External Investigator	A third party contracted service provider appointed by a WPO to conduct an investigation in accordance with the PID Act.		
identifying information (see s 20(1)(b), PID Act)	Information that was obtained by any person in their capacity as a public official that is likely to enable the identification of the discloser as a person who has made a public interest disclosure.		
internal disclosure	A public interest disclosure that is made to an authorised internal recipient, or a supervisor of the discloser and meets the following requirements:

	 The following are examples of personal work-related conduct: interpersonal conflict between public officials (e.g. bullying or harassment); conduct relating to the transfer or promotion; conduct relating to the terms and conditions of engagement or appointment; disciplinary action; the suspension or termination of employment or appointment as a public official; conduct in relation to which is, or would have been, entitled to review under section 33 of the <i>Public Service 25 Act 1999</i> or under any comparable review process that forms, or formed, part of terms or conditions of engagement or appointment.
PID or public interest disclosure (see s 26, PID Act)	 A disclosure of information by a current or former public official that meets the requirements of an internal disclosure. Other types of public interest disclosures (as defined in s 26 of the PID Act) include an external disclosure, emergency disclosure, legal practitioner disclosure and NACC disclosure. .
PID Act	Public Interest Disclosure Act 2013 (Cth).
PID Manual	 The manual setting out nbn's procedures in relation to disclosures made under or in accordance with the PID Act and comprising: this PID Glossary of Terms; PID Manual; PID Information Sheet for Disclosers; WPO and KPMG FairCall Guide to Receipt and Allocation of PIDs; WPO Guide to Pre-Investigation and Investigation of PIDs; PID Guide for Supervisors and Managers; PID Guide for Investigators; PID Guide to Risk Assessment, Support, Protection and Confidentiality; PID Process flowchart; and short-form Public Interest Disclosure Procedures.

POI or Person of Interest	A person who is the subject of a public interest disclosure.

public official (see s 69, PID Act)	 all employees and directors of an agency (including nbn); contracted service providers under a Commonwealth contract; and officers and employees of contracted service providers who provide services for the purpose (whether direct or indirect) of the Commonwealth contract. 			
reprisal (see s 13, PID Act)	Where someone engages in conduct that causes (or threatens to cause) any detriment to another person because they believe or suspect that person (or anyone else) has made, may have made, proposes to make, or could make a public interest disclosure, and that belief or suspicion is a reason for engaging in the conduct.			
supervisor (see s 8, PID Act)	A public official who supervises or manages the person who is making the disclosure which at nbn includes a member of EXCO and their Executive General Manager direct reports.			
WIO or Whistleblower Investigation Officer	An internal nbn employee who is appointed by a WPO to conduct an investigation in accordance with the PID Act.			
WPO or Whistleblower Protection Officer	 An nbn public official who: has been appointed, in writing, by the principal officer of nbn to be an authorised officer under s36(b) of the PID Act; and is a delegate of the principal officer of nbn under s 77(1) of the PID Act of all of the principal officer's functions and powers under the PID Act. nbn's WPOs are:
