nbn work starts in another part of Rockhampton for a super-fast future

If residents are seeing **nbn** trucks around Rockhampton, it's because the **nbn** has started construction in the region.

nbn construction started in Allenstown, Berserker, Depot Hill, Kawana, Park Avenue, Port Curtis, Rockhampton City, The Common, The Range, Wandal, West Rockhampton in late 2015.

The workforce in the area continued to mobilise and work started late last month on constructing Fibre to the Node technology to 1800 premises in Glenlee, Parkhurst and Rockyview.

Construction is then scheduled to move to 14,900 premises in Berserker, Frenchville, Kawana, Koongal, Lakes Creek, Limestone Creek, Nerimbera, Norman Gardens, Park Avenue this month.

Residents can expect to see **nbn** contractors boring and digging trenches, installing new pits, constructing cabinets, hauling, splicing and testing fibre cables, copper jointing and interfacing the copper network with the fibre network.

nbn Corporate Affairs Manager for Queensland, Kylie Lindsay said: "There is no doubt that as the world continues to change, our lives will become increasingly reliant on technology and the **nbn**^M network is helping to ensure that Australia keeps pace with other nations.

"Construction starting on more parts of the **nbn** in Rockhampton is great news for local residents and businesses.

"Access to fast broadband is designed to provide a range of benefits for homes and businesses such as improved opportunities to work from home, better access to online education and health tools and more options for on-demand entertainment.^{*}

"Whole families will be able to be online at the same time, using multiple devices and all enjoying the same fast speeds.

"And for businesses, be it e-commerce, sending and receiving files, accessing online services, internet and data security, cloud based sharing or communicating with staff and customers, all aspects will be faster and more efficient with the **nbn**[™] network."
